Our Story

There are thousands of stray animals in Sri Lanka suffering from horrific injuries, malnutrition and disease. Dogs and cats with fractured spines, severed limbs and maggot infested wounds; pups and kittens living on festering rubbish dumps; animals slowly dying of tick fever, womb infections and bleeding tumours, suffering in agony until they die. With the risk and associated fear of rabies, strays are often demonised, leading to cruelty at the hands of humans. This ocean of suffering and misery is heart breaking for any animal lover to witness, let alone walk away from. Animal SOS Sri Lanka, a UK registered charity, was founded on the vision of Kim Cooling who, after witnessing the appalling plight of animals there, particularly the strays, decided to take action to help them. With a distinct lack of safe havens and veterinary care available to street animals in Sri Lanka, our work and facilities are a lifeline to many otherwise doomed animals.

OUR ACHIEVEMENTS JANUARY - NOVEMBER 2024

- We are currently caring for 2265 dogs and 30 cats at the sanctuary
- We provided over 28,000 treatments for disease, wounds, fractures and tumours
- We sterilized 750 dogs and cats and conducted 500 other surgeries
- We provided over 13,000 blood tests/smears/biochemistry/haematology
- We provided over 12,500 antiparasitic treatments (worming, mange, tick/flea treatments)
- We provided over 12,000 vaccinations against rabies and other deadly viruses

Lavender - one of the babies of tragic Patti, the courageous mummy dog that ate food laced with explosives (hakka patas). With her jaw in pieces, Patti somehow kept herself alive for 5 days without food or water to show someone where her new-born babies were. When alerted, we promptly rescued the family, but Patti died soon after arriving at the sanctuary. She died knowing her pups were safe with us. This was 4 years ago but the pain remains in our hearts and always will. Patti lives on in Lavender who was adopted by Kim, the founder. Patti's other babies remain at the sanctuary.

Mamgu - Kim recently adopted this sweet little girl who originated from Kandy. Mamgu, a street pup, arrived at the sanctuary is a very weak state and with deformed limbs. She is now thriving in her new home.





Belvita - rescued as a pup and then adopted by a lovely couple who fell in love with her.



Cesare - a sicky kitty we nursed back to health, found the purrfect home.



Cash arrived at the sanctuary on the brink of death after being bitten by a dog on the streets. Despite his disabilities, he thrived under our care and now lives in the UK with the manager who loved and cared for him at the sanctuary.



Kiki - One of a litter of pups cruelly dumped in a box near dangerous predators such as venomous snakes and monitor lizards. The family were rescued by Kim and Kiki was later adopted by a lovely supporter and is now living the best life ever in the UK.

SOME OF THE MANY LIVES SAVED AND TRANSFORMED.





Midnight - Back in August we were alerted to a poor soul with a huge mass.

The dog was subsequently run over twice by a truck and then a bus and was left with a burst abscess, lying in water in a drain, disabled and helpless.

Our team went to rescue her around midnight, thus her name.

Midnight had a multitude of health issues but was lovingly nursed back from the brink and is mobile and healthy now. She remains at the sanctuary.



Baby came to us in August 2023. He was collapsed and at the end stage of Babesia Gibsoni- a tick-borne disease that is a huge killer of dogs in Sri Lanka.

ROCK'

Rocky was severely anaemic, jaundiced and totally flat on arrival. However, we invest in the best medicine for this disease and save many lives including dear Rocky.

As a disabled puppy **Lemon** was cruelly dumped by a lake at risk of being devoured by monitor lizards and other predators.

She was so weak and anaemic from babesia and had an ulcer on her eye.

Other places would have euthanized her as a hopeless case, but we fight to save them. Lemon is now healthy, walking and her eye condition has healed. She was spayed and fully vaccinated like all our rescues.





Clairey arrived in April as a disabled puppy after being attacked by a larger dog on the streets. After physiotherapy and treatments, we got her walking and running again!

We are the difference between life and death for these animals because we give them that precious chance when they need it the most.



Rani - She arrived as a sickly, anaemic pup with severe mange and blood parasites, but made a miraculous recovery and is a very cheeky girl now.

Cutie Patootie arrived in a horrific state and with an aggressive skin cancer on her leg. We had to amputate her leg, but we saved and transformed her life.

arrived at the

sanctuary a year ago, a victim of chaining which is extremely common in Sri Lanka. He developed a life threatening wound that was infested

by maggots and the owners discarded him like rubbish. At first Nutmeg was completely untouchable and aggressive due to cruel treatment by his owners but with time and lots of love, he has grown into a playful and lovable boy who is open to cuddles and always the first to greet you in the morning. Prince Charming arrived disabled and weak after an accident, but we nursed him back to health and he is walking now.



Uhtred was taken in as a pup with a serious brain trauma injury from a suspected road traffic accident. It was touch and go, but we fought hard and saved his life.

WINNING HEARTS & MINDS

"One of the most dangerous things that can happen to a child is to kill or torture an animal and get away with it" - Margaret Mead Sadly, we see a huge amount of animal cruelty in Sri Lanka and children are often involved.

With over 50% of the poor souls we take into the sanctuary being victims of horrific cruelty and abuse and with no effective animal protection laws in Sri Lanka, we know that changing attitudes towards animals is fundamental to lasting and sustainable change.

With that in mind, we launched our education program focused on the younger generation.

Venues for our programs are temples, colleges and schools. Our initial program was a huge success and we plan to do many more if we can raise the funds.





The venues are enthusiastic, which is amazing news. Engagement is one huge step foward. However, **each program incurs costs to the charity.**

At the programs we provide each child with a specially designed Love and Kindness colouring book and a box of crayons. We also had to fund the purchase of equipment and software for the presentation.
